
THE LEGACY NTINUES... Engagement Journal

- 2. How aware am I of the influence I have on others? In what ways have I seen evidence of this influence either positively and/or negatively?
- 3. In terms of giving and generosity, who taught me about generosity and/or had
 the biggest impact on me by their example of generosity?
 - 4. Who has set the best example to me about the time I should spend using my talents to serve in the church?
- 5. In reflecting on these questions and considering this Building on The Legacy Initiative, what things do I feel I need to do/change in terms of my generosity and the way(s) in which I serve in the church? How might those changes positively affect the influence I have on others?

Questions for Reflection

1. In the way that I live my life and set my priorities in life, are my sights set on
the realities of heaven or the realities of earth?

2. More specifically would I say that the giving of my time, talent and treasure is reflective of my sights being set on the realities of heaven or the realities of earth?

3. Through this Building on The Legacy Initiative, what changes do I think God might be challenging me to make in terms of the giving of my time, talent and treasure?

4. What is/are the barrier(s) that would try and keep me from making these changes? What is God asking me to do about these barrier(s)?

""I have never coveted anyone's silver or gold or fine clothes. You know that these hands of mine have worked to supply my own needs and even the needs of those who were with me.

should remember the words of the Lord Tesus: 'It is more blessed to give than to receive.''"

Questions for Reflection

- 1. In the passage, Paul is saying goodbye to the Ephesians clolers. They both know they will never see each other again. In his final words, Paul is essentially imploring them to live lives of radical generosity. Why do I think this would be his final message to them?
- 2. What am I intentionally doing right now to ensure that my children and/or others whom I influence around me are learning about the values of generosity?

 And about the giving of their time and talent?
- 3. Thus, far in my life, on what have I spent the most financial resources? How do I feel about that?
- 4. Am I giving financially and with my time and talent in a way that still changes me, or has it become comfortable and routine? What can I do about this?
 - 5. What am I beginning to feel that God wants me to commitment to RISURGE?
